


Disciple House Program

This program is selfsustaining. Members of the houses work and pay a modest rent and serve at our various outreaches. The houses also serve as housing and community for our Cookery Program students.

MANY PEOPLE SERVED!

UPPER ROOM is our weekly outreach in South Nashville's Woodbine Community that offers meals, shelter and community for up to 100 homeless men. In 2013, with your help, we were able to:

- Open on 104 regular shelter nights
- Open on 37 nights for extreme cold weather shelters during the 2013-2014 winter.
- Serve approximately 7800 dinners
- Serve approximately 7800 breakfasts
- Serve 300+ Thanksgiving Day meals
- Serve 430 Christmas Day meals
- Provide overnight shelter for between 50-130 men every Wednesday and Saturday
- 75+ volunteers gave well above 2593 hours of service: cooking, cleaning, prepping, delivering, transporting, food pickups interacting with our guests.
- Our volunteers consist of homeless and housed individuals, families from churches and civic groups and all walks of life –working together, building relationships, and serving each other.

It was a joyous celebration with delicious food.

The Cookery Program

Since our September opening through December 2013 we have worked with nine program enrollees. Two have successfully completed and graduated the program. Three students are still currently in the program. We are still in the early stages of perfecting the culinary training program.

OUR FIRST COOKERY PROGRAM GRADUATES

On March 11, 2014, graduates James Jones Jr. and Wiley Walker Jr. proudly received their diplomas in basic prep cooking, menu planning and kitchen managing alongside ServSafe Certification (a food and beverage safety training and certificate program administered by the National Restaurant Association).

A NEW BEGINNING

With the support of grants from local organizations such as The Boulevard Bolt, St. George Episcopal Church, The Dandridge Trust, private donations from churches and individuals, and the growing support of patrons at The Cookery, we are able to house and train all students in the program. Our first two graduates are currently now on staff at The Cookery, perfecting their skills and helping to bring others into their new beginnings.
