Note A- Summary of Nature of Activities and Significant Accounting Policies

Nature of Activities

Homework Hotline, Inc. (the Organization) is a not-for-profit corporation organized in Nashville, Tennessee in 1990. The purpose of the Organization is to establish, maintain and staff a call-in telephone program to provide homework assistance to students and their parents in the middle Tennessee area.

Cash and Cash Equivalents

For purposes of the statement of cash flows, the Organization considers all highly liquid investments available for current use with an initial maturity of three months or less to be cash. Certificates of deposit as of June 30, 2006 provide for an interest rate of 4.80%, 4.55%, and 4.89% and matured May 2007, November 2006, and November 2007 respectively. Three certificates of deposit at June 30, 2007 provide for an interest rate of 5.03%, 5.13%, and 5.03% and mature November 2008, May 2008, and November 2007 respectively.

Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

Property and Equipment

All acquisitions of property and equipment are stated at cost while donated equipment is stated at its fair market value on the date of receipt. Property and equipment are depreciated using the straight-line method over the estimated useful lives of the assets. Depreciation expense for the years ended June 30, 2007 and 2006 was \$1,467 and \$2,372 respectively.

Income Taxes

The Organization is a not-for-profit organization exempt from income taxes under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code and classified by the Internal Revenue Service as other than private foundation.

Financial Statement Presentation

Under Statement of Financial Accounting Standards (SFAS) No. 117, *Financial Statements of Not-for-Profit Organizations*, the organization is required to report information regarding its financial position and activities according to three classes of net assets: unrestricted net assets, temporarily restricted net assets, and permanently restricted net assets. Temporarily restricted net assets in the amount of \$5,400 were available for subsequent periods for years ended June 30, 2006 and \$12,500 at June 30, 2007.

Contributions

Under SFAS No. 116, Accounting for Contributions Received and Contributions Made, contributions received are recorded as unrestricted, temporarily restricted, or permanently restricted net assets depending on the absence or existence and nature of any donor imposed restrictions.

In-kind Contributions

In-kind contributions and the related expenses are recorded at their estimated fair market value on the date of receipt. For the years ended June 30, 2006 and 2005 in-kind contributions consisted of the following:

Note B- Expense Allocation

Functional Expenses

The costs of providing the organization's primary program and other activities have been summarized on a functional basis in the Statement of Activities and in the Statement of Functional Expenses. Accordingly, certain costs have been allocated among program expenses and management and general expenses. Management uses the direct cost allocation method to allocate cost among the functional areas.

Note C- Concentrations

The Organization received \$165,460 from WTVF for advertising and \$87,312 from Metro Nashville Public School System for teachers' salaries for the year ending June 30, 2007. For the year ended June 30, 2006 WTVF advertising donations were \$179,645 and Nashville Public School System teacher salary donations were \$71,649. Both donations were in the form of in-kind donations. If a significant reduction in this level of support were to occur, the Organization's programs and services could be adversely impacted.
