Beacon Center of Tennessee 2014 Projected Budget & Outline

With the 2014 proposed budget, Beacon will build upon its policy priorities, including advancing school choice, repealing the Hall Income Tax, and other legislative endeavors. Beacon will also continue to fight against a Medicaid expansion and the unionization of the Volkswagen Chattanooga plant, while also working to expose and defeat other liberal policies raised in our state.

More generally, this budget will take Beacon to the next step on its Permanent Freedom Majority roadmap by launching a robust communications arm and litigation center. The new communications director will have at his disposal the ammunition needed to take Beacon's message from one corner of Tennessee to the other. The new litigation director will have the capacity to defend Tennesseans rights in court and press for legal outcomes that generate a freer, more prosperous Tennessee. This budget also allows Beacon to maintain and grow its existing projects and priorities.
