# INDEPENDENT AUDITORS' REPORT

To the Board of Directors Franklin County Humane Society Winchester, Tennessee

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of the Franklin County Humane Society (a nonprofit organization), which comprise the statement of financial position as of December 31, 2013, and the related statements of activities, functional expenses, and cash flows for the year then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

# Management's Responsibility for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America; this includes the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

## Auditors' Responsibility

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit. We conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. Those standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatement.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. The procedures selected depend on the auditors' judgment, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditors consider internal control relevant to the entity's preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the entity's internal control. ## NOTE 1 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Franklin County Humane Society is a local animal shelter that operates to prevent cruelty to animals, to educate the community, to maintain a foster care and adoption program, and to reduce future generations of unwanted companion animals by developing and maintaining a low cost spay/neuter program.

The financial statements of Franklin County Humane Society have been prepared on an accrual basis. The significant accounting policies are described below to enhance the usefulness of the financial statements to the reader.

Contributions are recognized when the donor makes a promise to give to the Franklin County Humane Society that is, in substance, unconditional. Contributions that are restricted by the donor are reported as increases in unrestricted net assets if the restrictions expire in the fiscal year in which the contributions are recognized. All other donor-restricted contributions are reported as increases in temporarily or permanently restricted net assets depending on the nature of the restrictions. When a restriction expires, temporarily restricted net assets are reclassified to unrestricted net assets. A description of the net assets categories follows.

Unrestricted net assets include the following:

- A. General & Administrative: General includes the revenues and expenses associated with the principal mission of the Franklin County Humane Society.
- B. Land, Buildings, and Equipment: Land, Buildings, and Equipment assets are stated at market valuation as of October 29, 2001, plus subsequent additions at cost, less accumulated depreciation, computed on a straight-line basis over the estimated useful lives of the assets.

Temporarily restricted net assets include gifts for which donor imposed restrictions have not been met, trust activity, and pledges receivable for which the ultimate purpose of the proceeds is not permanently restricted.

The financial statements present expenses by functional classification in accordance with the overall service mission of the Society. Each functional classification displays all expenses related to the underlying operations by natural classification. Interest expense on external debt is allocated to the functional categories, which have benefited from the proceeds of the external debt.

### NOTE 2 – ESTIMATES

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires managements to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

### NOTE 3 – CASH

As of December 31, 2013, cash is made up of the following amounts:

## NOTE 4 – PHYSICAL PROPERTIES

Property additions are recorded at cost or fair market value if donated. Depreciation is calculated using the straight-line method over the estimated useful life. Expenses for additions, improvements, and replacements are added to the property accounts while expenses for maintenance and repairs are expensed currently.

Interest is capitalized in connection with the construction of major facilities. The construction period interest is recorded as part of the asset to which it is related and is amortized over the asset's estimated useful life. No interest was capitalized for the year ended December 31, 2013.

The Society follows the policy of recording contributions of long-lived assets directly in investment in plant assets instead of recognizing their gift over the useful life of the asset. The amounts shown are from market valuation as of October 29, 2001, plus subsequent additions at cost or fair market value if donated.

# NOTE 5 – TAX EXEMPT STATUS

The Franklin County Humane Society has been recognized as a non-profit organization exempt from federal income taxes under the Internal Revenue Code Section 501(c)(3).

# NOTE 6 – EXPENDABLE RESTRICTED RESOURCES

Operating and plant funds restricted by the donor, grantor, or other outside party for particular operating purposes or for plant acquisitions are deemed to be earned and reported as revenues of operating funds or as additions to plant funds, respectively, when they are received by the Society.

## NOTE 7 – CASH FLOWS

For purposes of the statement of cash flows, Franklin County Humane Society considers all highly liquid investments (including restricted assets) with a maturity of three months or less when purchased to be cash equivalents.

### NOTE 8 - CASH DEPOSITS

The Society's cash deposits at year-end in the amount of \$280,043.18 less petty cash of \$400 and \$5.00 in a PayPal account, were covered entirely by federal depository insurance.

### NOTE 9 – NET ASSETS

### NOTE 10 - EMPLOYEE BENEFITS

The Society does not offer insurance or retirement benefits. All employees other than the shelter manager are part-time employees and are not offered vacation or sick leave. The manager is allowed accrual of vacation only at 0.02 hours per hour worked, with a maximum of 41.6 hours per year. Accrued compensated absences at December 31, 2013, were \$290.56.

### NOTE 11 – DONATED ITEMS/SERVICES

Donated marketable securities and other noncash donations are recorded as contributions at their estimated fair values at the date of donation.

Donated services are recognized as contributions in accordance with FASB ASC topic, *Accounting for Contributions Received and Contributions Made*, if the services (a) create or enhance nonfinancial assets or (b) require specialized skills, are performed by people with those skills, and would otherwise be purchased by the Society. For the year ended December 31, 2013, no amounts for donated services have been reflected in the financial statements, as they do not meet the criteria for recognition.

### NOTE 12 – INVESTMENTS

At the beginning of 2013, the Franklin County Humane Society owned stock with a market value of \$9,639.23. After unrealized gains of \$580.38, the investments were sold for \$10,219.61. The Society held no stocks at December 31, 2013.

## NOTE 13 - PLEDGES

Pledges consist of unconditional promises to give through solicited funds and fundraisers. At December 31, 2013, the Franklin County Humane Society had temporarily restricted unconditional promises to give in the amount of \$72,070.00, unrestricted unconditional promises to give of \$2,328.70 and \$5,000.00 allowance for bad debt for a total of \$69,398.70. Of this amount, \$33,768.70 is current and the remaining \$35,630.00 is not expected in the next year.

## NOTE 14 – ADVERTISING COSTS

Advertising costs are expensed as incurred. Advertising expense totaled \$0.00 in 2013.

### NOTE 15 – RESTATEMENT

Temporarily restricted net assets have been adjusted at the beginning of the current fiscal year for expenses recognized as unrestricted in prior years. This restatement resulted in an increase in unrestricted net assets of \$15,607.87 and a corresponding decrease in temporarily restricted net assets.
