VALENTINE, THE GRAMMY® AWARD-WINNING NASHVILLE SYMPHONY HAS RECEIVED NATIONAL AND INTERNATIONAL RECOGNITION FOR ITS EXCEPTIONAL MUSICIANSHIP AND ADVENTUROUS PROGRAMMING. THE SYMPHONY PERFORMS MORE THAN 140 CONCERTS ANNUALLY, INCLUDING CLASSICAL, POPS, JAZZ, A FAMILY SERIES AND A VARIETY OF SPECIAL EVENTS.
