Mission

Our Mission is to deliver quality, compassionate healthcare and health education to those without insurance or the ability to pay for the services they need to ensure our community's physical and spiritual wellbeing.

Background

Over a decade ago, a bold vision of providing compassionate quality healthcare to our uninsured neighbors was realized. The vision was instilled with God's kingdom of love, hope, mercy, and power. "He sent them to preach the kingdom of God and to heal the sick" Luke 9:2. That same bold vision that started Charis Health Center in 2007 continues today. Charis Health Center is located in Mount Juliet, Tennessee and provides affordable healthcare to the uninsured in Middle Tennessee. Charis operates with a small staff and cadre of dedicated volunteers out of two clinic locations and a mobile health clinic. Since 2007, Charis has delivered quality, compassionate, healthcare and health education to those without insurance or the ability to pay for services they need to ensure our community's physical and spiritual wellbeing.

Impact

Over the past year, there have been significant improvements in both the governance and management of Charis Health Centers as well as the services provided to patients. In 2018, a new Executive Director was hired. With this change in leadership has come financial stability, increased volunteer and staff satisfaction, and a wider community outreach. Charis Health Centers continues to offer quality, compassionate care, addressing health concerns as well as spiritual and social needs in the community. Focus from the leadership of the Board and Executive Director has ensured the services provided to the community are faith-based, administered as a ministry of Christ, and serves the needs of the community. The 35 volunteers that serve the organization have a wide breadth and diversity of experience. They are very loyal and morale among them has increased significantly. Nurse practitioners and providers are also increasingly appreciated and recognized for their efforts and impact on patients and the organization. The organization has seen patient numbers and visits for services increase over the past year and has been able to effectively meet this increase in demand. As seen above, the demographics of patients and the nature of services provided to them is changing. Over the past

year, there was a significant increase in 40 - 64-year-olds visiting the clinics. This represents a changing demographic in the county and reflects the continued need for provision of low-cost health services in Wilson County for the "working poor." Charis Health Centers continues to respond to the needs of the community both in terms of access, services provided, and approach to service provision. With two locations successfully delivering services to the community, the organization has been able to serve in areas where it was most needed.

Needs

The Primary Health Care Crisis is a phrase we have heard many times. Often, it reflects not just a societal circumstance but a reality for health care professionals working firsthand with the medically underserved or vulnerable. For the second year in a row since the implementation of the Affordable Care Act (ACA), the number of uninsured individuals increased from 2017 to 2018 by nearly 500,000 people. (source: Kaiser Family Foundation,2019) Even under the ACA, many uninsured individuals cite the cost of insurance as the main reason they lack coverage. Individuals without health coverage have extremely limited access to health care. Without affordable access to medical care uninsured individuals are taking on large medical debt to meet health care needs. It is estimated within the State of Tennessee 24.1% of residents have medical debt totaling over 2 Trillion Dollars; and one in five adults in 2018 went without needed medical care do to cost. (source: kff,2019) Studies repeatedly demonstrate the uninsured are less likely than those with medical insurance to receive preventative care and services for major health conditions and chronic disease. Because the uninsured receive fewer preventative and diagnostic services, they tend to be more severely ill when diagnosed.

Statement from CEO/Executive Director

When you visit Charis Health Center today you will see more than a new logo on the door. You will see new leadership that is dedicated to patient growth and clinic sustainability. You will see new partnerships that have made new services possible for patients. And most importantly, you will see a clinic dedicated to improving the health of not just our uninsured neighbors, but also the health equity of the whole community. For the second year in a row, Charis Health Center has seen record breaking new patient growth. 42% of the patients seen in 2019 were new patients. Charis is also blessed to be able to offer new exciting services to patients through new partnerships. It is because of new partnerships Charis is able to now offer free medications to patients on cite and free women's health services to those that qualify. I want to say thank you to all who made our successes possible. Charis' successes could not have been possible without our dedicated staff, volunteers, board of directors, partners, and donors. Each of our partners make it possible for Hope to meet Healing. We have witnessed healing for anyone who walks through our doors - patients, staff, volunteers; physical, emotional, and spiritual healing! I pray blessings upon each of our partners that help make Charis a possibility to so many of our friends and neighbors, and may you know the eternal difference you are making in the lives of thousands.

Statement from Board Chair

Charis Health Center is a faith-based, affordable primary health care provider serving the uninsured. Charis Health Center is the only facility of its type in Wilson County. Prior to the Center opening, Wilson County was the only county surrounding Nashville without such a health care center. It is estimated there are approximately 20,000 working uninsured in Wilson County alone, and the number grows as does our population. The need is great. With the continued growth and development in Wilson County, particularly with small businesses who cannot afford health benefits, the need for Charis Health Center is also growing. One of the most extraordinary truths about Charis Health Center is it is staffed almost completely by volunteers, both medical and non-medical. Charis currently employs four part-time family nurse practitioners, partially funded by a grant received from Baptist Healing Trust of Nashville, TN. In 2014, Charis stepped out in faith to fund a full time Executive Director. The role of the Executive Director is to create sustainability for the Health Center by building financial support, attracting the uninsured to utilize services, and to partner with the community in general to help provide additional resources for the Health Center. This is an essential position for Charis to gain support and grow to meet the needs of the community. Charis Health Center is an exciting ministry that churches, individuals, and service clubs can support. To care for the sick is certainly one of our basic faith challenges. Charis began providing primary health care services on January 14, 2008. Due to the passion and

commitment of its volunteers, Charis has accomplished much since its inception. The significance of Charis' Mission has been recognized by local corporations and foundations. The HCA Foundation offered its support by enabling Charis to develop a business plan under the guidance of the Center for Non-Profit Management; all this in an effort to ensure Charis establishes a solid foundation to facilitate a sustainable future while addressing a critical social issue and basic need - access to affordable, quality health-care.
